Life Transformation Groups

The beauty of Life Transformation Groups is their simplicity! LTG's consist of 2 to 3 people of the same sex who meet weekly to do 3 things:

1. Read (on your own during the week) and discuss (when you meet) large amounts of Scripture together. (25-30 chapters)
2. Confess your sins to one another.
3. Pray for your lost friends (everyone targets 2 people and the group prays weekly for these 4 to 6 people to become increasingly open to Jesus.)

LTG's are NOT a substitute for a cell – but rather an extension of what a cell exists to do. We all know that a cell provides a level of accountability but only goes so far. Also, because a cell is application-oriented rather than a Bible study, an LTG provides the opportunity for increased Bible learning and growth!

We're asking our cell leaders to help facilitate – but not responsible for LTG's. Since LTG's only take 2 or 3 people (if you have 4, form two LTG's!) all it takes is finding a minimum of one other man or woman to form a Life Transformation Group with you. You can meet anytime during the week that fits your schedules. LTG's do NOT meet during the cell meeting, but hopefully the relationships will flow out of a cell. Since you only meet for about an hour be creative about when your LTG might meet: for breakfast, over lunch, immediately after work or school, on Sunday morning before coming to Celebration, etc. An LTG doesn't necessarily require another whole evening out of your schedule!

- **What do I have to do to get started?** Find 1 or 2 others of your same sex in your cell who want to form a LTG. Talk with your cell leader(s) to let them know you've formed a Life Transformation Group.
- **What's the first step?** See your district pastor to get a LTG brochure. It explains everything in detail and provides the accountability questions you'll use each week along with places for the names of the 4 to 6 "normal" people you'll be praying for on a convenient tear-off page to keep in your Bible.
- **What if nobody in my cell wants to be part of a LTG?** Look past your cell to others in your zone (under the same coach) or in your district (under the same district pastor). The closer you stay to relational connections (cell, zone, district, etc.) the more naturally LTG's will flow.
- **What if my LTG grows?** That's the goal – just like cells, the goal is to grow and multiply.
- **What if my LTG doesn't work?** Because of the loose structure, that is going to happen! If it does, it's no big deal – Just look for another 1 or 2 people to form a new LTG.
