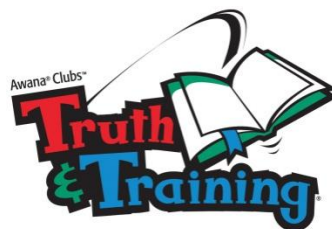




Missions-Related Sections

Sparks and Truth & Training



Green Jewel 2:1

- Find the name of a missionary (you may ask your parents, your Sparks Leader or someone else in your church)
- Paste a picture of your missionary on p.56, and write their name on p.57

Green Jewel 2:2

- Write the name of the country where your missionary works on p.56
- Ask an adult to help you find the country or at least the continent of the country on the map on pp.56 & 57
- Show your Sparks Leader where the country is on the map

Green Jewel 2:3

- Find out what your missionary does to tell people about Jesus. Tell your Sparks Leader what your missionary does

Green Jewel 2:4

- Pray for missionaries
- Say Colossians 1:3



Red Jewel 2:1

- Write a popular name for a boy or girl who lives in another country
- Write two things about the country where this boy or girl lives

Red Jewel 2:2

- Draw a picture of something from the country (the flag, a person, food, etc.)



Green Jewel 2:1

- Ask your Sparks Leader about the Awana Missionary in your area
- Pray for your Missionary
- Write a letter to your Awana Missionary
 - Tell the missionary something about yourself and your club
 - Draw pictures or include photos if you like!
 - Tell the missionary you prayed for him or her
- Give the letter to your Sparks Leader to mail (or e-mail)

Note: All of HangGlider Green Jewel 2, WingRunner Red Jewel 2 and SkyStormer Green Jewel 2 are missionary activities. The above sections are the ones that involve actual vocational missionaries. Those not listed are missionary-related things the clubbers accomplish.



Book 1 (Red) Discovery 8:4

- Talk to or write a letter to a missionary in which you ask them:
 - Where do you work?
 - What do you do as a missionary?
 - [You come up with two questions of your own and ask them]

Book 1 (Red) Discovery 1 – GOLD Extra Credit

- Read a missionary biography and report on it (oral or written)

Book 1 (Red) Discovery 2 – GOLD Extra Credit

- Find out how to say John 3:16 in another language. Learn how to say it in that language

Book 2 (Blue) Discovery 6:7

- Find a missionary that your church supports (gives money to) Ask your leader for help if you do not attend church regularly)



- Learn all you can about the country where that missionary serves
 - Draw a map of the country
 - List the capital and important cities
 - List the important businesses in that country
 - Write 5 sentences about how the missionary serves the Lord there
- Show your leader your work

Book 2 (Blue) Discovery 6 – GOLD (2) Extra Credit

- Choose a missionary who serves in another country (can be the same missionary you wrote about in Discovery 6:7, just add extra information)
 - Find out everything you can about the country where that missionary serves, and do the following activities:
 - Draw the flag of the country
 - Prepare a recipe from that country
 - Write a one-page report on the country
 - (Is it hilly or a desert? What crops grow there? What are the biggest cities? What are some animals that live in the country?)
- Find out about the missionary. In what way do they serve the Lord?
- Show your work to your leader

Book 2 (Blue) Discovery 8 – GOLD (2) Extra Credit

- Write a letter to your leader telling how much you appreciate him or her. Copy the letter four more times. Give a copy to your Director, to your Pastor, to Your Awana Missionary, and send one to Awana Headquarters so we can hear about your great leader



Book 1 (Green) Challenge 4:3

- Do some research. Find out about Christian kids your age who live outside your country. You could learn about a Sunday School class, an Awana Club, or another program for kids. You can talk to your Awana Missionary or another Missionary who visits your church. If you are allowed on the internet, you can check a missions web site (be sure to check with your parents). Check with your leader before you choose a missionary. As questions like these:
 - How is the children's program in the other country different than yours?
 - Where do the children meet?
 - What are the names of the teachers or leaders of the program?
 - What are the children learning?
 - Do they have uniforms? What are the uniforms like?
- Show the information to your leader

Book 1 (Green) Challenge 5:7

- Encourage a missionary's son or daughter, either by yourself, or as a group (T&T'ers in another book can help you with this project-be in your group). Here are some things you can do:
 - Pray for the boy or girl
 - Mail birthday cards
 - Send e-mail messages
 - Take a picture of your group and mail or e-mail it
 - Interview the child by snail-mail, e-mail or phone. Ask about life as a missionary kid
 - If the boy or girl lives in your country, you could purchase a small birthday or Christmas gift

Book 2 (Yellow) Challenge 6 – GOLD (1) Extra Credit

- Plan a "help a missionary" project
 - Plan a penny drive for your Awana Missionary
 - Work with a leader to plan a theme-night around the country where your church has an Adopt-A-Club
 - If your church has a missionary closet, help collect items for it
 - Ask your church's missions committee how you could help at the church missions conference
