## Another Angel ...

God keeps bringing Angels into our lives ... first it was Angelica in Don Salvador then Angel from further up the mountain that had the eye tumor and **now this one** ...

This Angel is four years old. Her **mother died from tuberculosis**. She has three brothers (pictured below).

The father is destitute and cannot afford to support the children so he brought the four children to Recovered Treasures on a temporary basis ... **that was three years ago**.

If he can garner the fare the father tries to visit the children twice a month. If he cannot get the fare (about 60 cents) he visits once a month.



I saw the father visiting the children a few weeks ago. I did not understand the situation (many children have been abused) so I told the caregiver to keep an eye on the father during the visit

**I then learned about his plight. Next time I see him I will hug him and assure him that we will take care of his children.** As a father serving as a missionary I know what it is like to place your daughter in the care of another ... and there is peace knowing she is being taken care of.
